

RE: A meeting with you to discuss ways to dismantle the "Black Wall"

Honorable Attorney General Becerra,

Thank you for following through on your pledge to investigate the direct evidence of a very serious crime which is continuing in the Fourth District Division One Court of Appeal (4<sup>th</sup>/1<sup>st</sup>) and the San Diego Superior Court. It is harming thousands of people and is being aided to continue by remaining improperly unpunished by the Commission on Judicial Performance (CJP) et.al. Mr. Alberto Gonzalez from your agency is working to schedule an appointment for me with a representative in your Criminal Division in Sacramento. Thank you.

Unfortunately the ethics problems which I have personally encountered in the California courts are not unique. Most people are familiar with the term "a Blue Wall" and how it fuels unethical and criminal conduct among those who wear blue uniforms. A Blue Wall deters the public's and honest police officers' abilities to thwart misconduct within law enforcement agencies.

In California, we are experiencing a similar problem among those who wear black robes. The "Black Wall" is causing loss of justice for the public and is causing justified fear of retaliation for court employees who do not dare speak of it.

As California's chief law enforcer, we believe that you can help to curtail crime in our courts. My colleagues, Kathleen Russell and Joseph Sweeney, and I would like to meet with you in March to discuss how you can help.

As you know, my background is in marketing. I am a medical journal published author on the subject of a mass-marketed flawed risk model, the Veritox Theory, purposed to cause discrimination of the environmentally disabled in toxic torts. In 2006, I moderated a U.S. Senate staff briefing that was sponsored by the late Senator Edward Kennedy and Senator Jeffords. I was instrumental in causing the Federal Government Accountability Office (GAO) audit, "*INDOOR MOLD: Better Coordination of Research on Health Effects and More Consistent Guidance Would Improve Federal Efforts*". My work has been cited by publications such as WorkCompCentral, the Wall Street Journal and many public health policy research papers.

Mr. Sweeney is the CEO of Court Reform LLC, a Bay Area justice reform organization. Ms. Russell is the Executive Director of the nonprofit Center for Judicial Excellence. It is headquartered in Marin County and has members from across California and the United States.

They have both been published and have had their work cited by dozens of newspapers in the state. They have both worked with multiple investigative reporters to expose problems in the courts, purposed toward the goal of causing solutions.

Their work includes drafting the California Bureau of the State Auditor's (BSA) audit-scope of the Commission on Judicial Performance (CJP). They spearheaded and organized a campaign for the audit. It was supported by the Service Employees International Union (SEIU), the California Judges Association (CJA) and multiple other organizations concerned by the lack of integrity and autonomy of California's courts. The BSA audit-request was approved by unanimous vote of the Joint Legislative Audit Committee (JLAC) in August of 2016. On behalf of the public's and honest court employees' best interests, we are seeking that policy changes be initiated by you. We have suggested practices which we believe could be implemented by you in conjunction with the CJP and county district attorneys. We believe these lawful practices would greatly weaken the Black Wall's strength.

Please let us know what dates you are available so we may schedule a meeting to discuss our ideas with you in an effort to deter court crime. We require no more than a one hour meeting and would prefer to meet in Sacramento.

Thank you again for your follow through re: 4<sup>th</sup>/1<sup>st</sup> obstruction of justice for thousands via obstructing the vacating of fake-dated court documents in Strategic Litigation Against Public Participation (SLAPP).
